- 1. Board members who travel in their own vehicles while engaged in recognized school duties shall be reimbursed by the District at the rate established by the IRS.
- 2. Board members shall receive per-meeting or annual salary reimbursement as established by the annual meeting.
- 3. When school duties require a Board member to be absent from his/her regular employment, he/she shall receive reimbursement as established by the annual meeting or State law (120.10).
- 4. Board of Education members shall also be reimbursed for expenses incurred in attending meetings sponsored by Departments of the State of Wisconsin, Administrator of Cooperative Education Service Agencies, the Wisconsin Association of School Boards, insurance seminars, and one annual meeting, per member, of a National Association. Reimbursement requires itemized voucher sworn to by the member and receipts where possible.
- 5. Board members will submit quarterly claims for meetings and expenses. Payments shall be made following quarterly meetings for March, June, September, and December.
- 6. On or before the 4th Monday in April, school board members should provide written notification that they wish to refuse to accept per meeting fee or salary that he or she is entitled to receive. The notification must be renewed annually and cannot be rescinded during the year.

SCHOOL DISTRICT OF PHILLIPS EDUCATIONAL OPTIONS January 2020

The School District of Phillips offers students who reside in the District a variety of educational options for district students and students opting to attend through open enrollment.

Annually, each public school must provide to the parent or guardian of each pupil enrolled in or attending the school a list of the educational options available to children who reside in the pupil's resident district, including: public schools, private schools participating in a parental choice program, charter schools, virtual schools, full-time open enrollment, course options, and options for students enrolled in a home-based private educational program.

The Department of Public Instruction (DPI) generates a School Report Card and District Report Card for every publicly-funded school and district in the state. These public report cards can be found online at: http://dpi.wi.gov/accountability/report-cards. The Report Cards are intended to help schools and districts utilize performance data to target their improvement efforts so that students are ready for their next educational step – including the next grade level, graduation, college, and careers.

Schools receive a score for priority areas of

- 1) Student achievement (proficiency in English Language Arts (ELA) and mathematics on the annual state assessments;
- 2) School growth (measured by year-t-year progress in ELA and math achievement;
- 3) Closing Gaps in performance between specific student groups; and
- 4) On-Track and Postsecondary Readiness (showing reliable predictors of how many students are on-track to graduate from high school and student readiness for post-high school success.)

Overall the School District of Phillips received a rating of Meets Expectations. The District's schools and each school's most recent state-assigned performance category are listed below. Data given is from the 2017-18 school year report cards.

Phillips Elementary School (Meets Expectations)

Offers programs for 4K through Grade 5

Offers special education programming for students age 3 through Grade 5

Phillips Middle School (Exceeds Expectations)

Offers programs for Grades 6-8 regular and special education

Phillips High School (Meets Expectations)

Offers programs for Grades 9-12 regular and special education

There are no private schools participating in the parental choice program within the School District of Phillips boundaries.

<u>Virtual School Options</u>: The School District of Phillips is a member of the Rural Schools Virtual Academy which offers virtual programing to resident students. For other virtual schools available for open enrollment, contact DPI at dpi.wi.gov/imt/digital-learning/virtual-schools.

<u>Open Enrollment</u>: The inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend public school in a school district other than the one in which they reside. The regular open enrollment application period typically begins the first Monday of February of the preceding school year and ends at 4:00 pm on April 30th. The best way to apply is online via link on the DPI's website: dpi.wi.gov. .Paper copies can also be picked up in the district office. An alternative open enrollment procedure allows pupils to apply for open enrollment at any time during a school year if certain criteria are met. Additional information regarding this procedure can be found on the DPI Open Enrollment – Parent page. Also Board Policy 425.

<u>Part-Time Open Enrollment:</u> A pupil enrolled in a public school in the high school grades may attend public school in a nonresident school district for the purpose of taking a course offered by the nonresident school district. A pupil may attend no more than two courses at any time in nonresident school districts. See https://dpi.wi.gov/open-enrollment/ptoe

<u>Pupils Enrolled in Home-based Private Education Programs Options</u> – "Home-based private educational program" means a program of educational instruction provided to a child by the child's parent or guardian or by a person designed by the parent or guardian. An instructional program provided to more than one family unit does not constitute a home-based private educational program. (Wisc State Stat 115.001(3g).

Home-based students are supported within the available resources of the District by the District providing: 1) requested curriculum documents, 2) instructional material such as textbooks when supplies are available, 3) access to the IMC during school hours when pre-arranged through the building principal and 4) up to two courses for children grades 9-12 in accordance with the District's Public School Open Enrollment policy 425, section II(b). (Board Policy 3881.4)

Northcentral Technical College - A student may be eligible to receive dual credit through an arrangement in which high school students earn both high school and college credit. Technical college courses are taught in the high school by college certified high school instructors. Only juniors and seniors will receive college credit. If an underclassman would like to take the course without the college credit, they may do so and receive high school credit only. A list of transcripted courses is available in the Phillips High School Registration Manual.

Advanced Placement - A student may be eligible to receive credit for certain college courses by completing Advanced Placement (AP) classes in high school and passing the corresponding AP exam. Students are responsible for paying the exam fee. Fee waivers are available to those who qualify. Phillips High School offers Advanced Placement courses in the following areas: Calculus, Chemistry and English Literature and Composition.

Early College Credit Program/Start College Now - Students who have attained junior status (earned a minimum of 16 credits) are eligible to participate enroll in courses through post-secondary educational institutions such as the University of Wisconsin or the Wisconsin

Technical College System (WTCS). Courses taken through this program must not be comparable to courses offered by the high school. Students who wish to take courses must not have a record of disciplinary problems. Applications for the program and additional information can be requested through your school counselor. Applications for the fall semester must be received in the office by March 1, or for the spring semester by October 1.

Youth Apprenticeship Program - This program is an initiative of the State of Wisconsin to offer one- or two-year programs. The program's intent is to provide a way for Juniors and Seniors to begin career development through both work-based and school-based learning. School-based learning can involve courses through a technical college. Access to apprenticeships is based on local business opportunities and the willingness of a student with a good attendance record to commit to the program. Apprenticeships potentially available in this area include auto collision, mechanical design, financial services, health services, hospitality and tourism, engineering, information technology/networking, logistics, machining, production technician, plastics, agriculture and welding.

Hillcrest Consulting Forestry LLC Timber Sale Contract

Agreement entered into between the Landowner, <u>Phillips School District</u>, hereinafter referred to as the "landowner" and <u>Futurewood</u>, hereinafter called the "Purchaser". Purchaser may cut and remove all forest products marked or designated by the seller on the following described lands hereinafter called the premises:

County: Price Town Name: Town of Worcester

Town: 37N Range: 1E Section: 4 S1/2 SW1/4 and SW 1/4 SE 1/4
Town: 37N Range: 1E Section: 9 N1/2 NW1/4 and NW 1/4 NE 1/4

Which are further described in maps and attachments made a part of this contract.

This contract and all authority granted under it, as mutually agreed upon by the parties, is subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Cutting of timber on the premises may start after the Landowner, Consulting Forester and Purchaser have signed this contract, and will continue with reasonable diligence so that the logging operation will be completed no later than <u>August 1</u>, <u>2022</u>. An extension of time may, however, be granted by the Landowner/ Consulting Forester with appropriate adjustments in stumpage rates as determined by the Consulting Forester. The Consulting Forester may temporarily suspend this contract at any time.
- 2. Before cutting or removing any timber under this contract, Purchaser will deposit with the Landowner/Consulting Forester on or before <u>January 25, 2020</u>, a performance bond in the amount of <u>S16,365.91 (Sixteen Thousand Three Hundred Sixty-Five Dollars and Ninety-One Cents)</u> as a guarantee that Purchaser intends to carry out the provisions of the contract.
- 3. Purchaser shall notify the Consulting Forester, either verbally or in writing, before beginning any logging operations.
- 4. The Consulting Forester shall give the Purchaser notice in the event of a breach of any condition of the contract. All operations shall cease forthwith upon receipt of such notice by the Purchaser, and continued occupancy shall be a trespass. Operations may not be resumed without authorization from the Consulting Forester.
- 5. The Landowner may terminate this contract for a breach of any condition or for any reason deemed necessary by the Consulting Forester by giving the Purchaser written notice thereof.
- 6. Purchaser will comply with the specifications for operations under this contract. These specifications are attached to and made a part of this contract.
- 7. If the Consulting Forester and Landowner determine there is a breach of any conditions, then at the discretion of the Consulting Forester the entire deposit or performance bond or any portion there of shall be forfeited to the Landowner for damages. Before returning any cash or the performance bond to the Purchaser, the Consulting Forester shall have 90 days from the time a notice is received of the completion date or termination date, whichever occurs first, to inspect the premises to determine if the contract has been satisfactorily performed. In addition to exercising any of its rights under the performance bond or in connection with this clause or the deposit, the Landowner may also seek actual damages and other remedies available to it under the law or this contract.
- 8. Maximum stump height shall not exceed stump diameter, and for stumps of diameter less than 10 inches, it shall not exceed 10 inches.
- 9. All and only the timber marked or designated for cutting on the premises shall be cut whether it be more or less than the volume listed herein. Unmarked or undesignated trees cut or damaged through carelessness, negligence, or intention shall be paid for at double the stumpage rate specified or at a rate to be determined by the Consulting Forester, if not specified.

- 10. Any timber wasted in tops, broken in careless felling, or not removed on termination of this contract shall be paid for at double the specified rate.
- 11. The Purchaser agrees to complete all operations on each portion of the premises as designated in the cutting requirements.
- 12. The volumes of timber indicated in this contract or other appraisal, cruise, or timber sale documents of the Landowner, determined by the Consulting Forester, are estimates. The Landowner and Consulting Forester give no warranty or guarantee respecting the quantity, quality, or volume of marked or otherwise designated timber or forest products on the premise.
- 13. Conversion of MBF (thousand board feet) to cords or cords to MBF will be 2.44 cords per MBF for softwoods and 2.20 cords per MBF for Hardwoods.
- 14. All saw logs must be separated from pulpwood when piled.
- 15. All logs will be scaled with the Scribner Decimal C Log Rule,
- 16. Location, construction, improvement and use of logging roads, landings, recreational trails and wildlife food plots is subject to advance approval by the Consulting Forester. All such areas or facilities used or constructed by the Purchaser must be operated, maintained and restored in a manner satisfactory to the Landowner and the Consulting Forester prior to termination of the contract. Woods roads must be restored to previous shape by the August 10th each year the contract is active. Purchaser is responsible for any damages to neighboring properties roads that are used.
- 17. All pulpwood and saw logs will be recorded using mill scale slips. The Purchaser agrees to send a copy of all scale slips from the mill to the Consulting Forester. Stumpage will be paid off of the mill scale slips and will be sent to the Consulting Forester.
- 18. The Purchaser agrees to pay for the cost of repair or replacement of any land survey monuments or accessories, which are removed, destroyed or made inaccessible. This does not preclude action under Section 59.635 of Wisconsin State Statutes.
- 19. All activities must be in accordance with Wisconsin's Forestry Best Management Practices for Water Quality.
- 20. Purchaser shall be liable for all trespass committed by Purchaser outside of sale boundaries.
- 21. Purchaser shall do all in their power to cooperate with the fire protection officers to prevent and suppress forest fires and to comply with all state laws regarding timber slash disposal. Roadways and trails shall be kept free from brush and waste resulting from the operation.
- 22. The decision of the Consulting Forester as to whether the Purchaser is in compliance with the terms of this confract shall be final.
- 23. The Purchaser is precluded from assigning payment and contract oversight, duties or other performance requirements of this contract to another. The Purchaser's direction to or contracting with another to complete performance required under this contract does not relieve the Purchaser from the responsibility for performance required or from the liability of a breach under this contract.
- 24. The Purchaser agrees to protect, indemnify and save harmless the Landowner and Consulting Forester from and against any and all causes of action, claims, demands, suits, liability or expense by reason of loss or damage to any property or bodily injury to any person, including death, as a direct or indirect result of timbering operations or in connection with any action or omission of the Purchaser, who shall defend the Landowner in any such cause of action or claim.
- 25. The Purchaser shall be in compliance with the Wisconsin Workman's Compensation act, Chapter 102, Wisconsin State Statutes, and all rules promulgated thereunder. The Purchaser must present a current Certificate of Insurance, to the Landowner and (or) Consulting Forester and kept on file at all times for the active timber sale.

- 26. Payment of removed forest products will be made biweekly to the Landowner and be received by the Consulting Forester.
- 27. All modifications to this contract must be in writing signed by the parties hereto.
- 28. If the Purchaser ceases to exist, in fact or by law, the Landowner may terminate this contract without any remedies available to it and take all action necessary to assure its performance.
- 30. The use of public road rights-of-way for the skidding, landing, or decking of forest products is prohibited unless, preapproved by the town in which the sale is located. The purchaser will be held responsible for any damages induced to the town road as a result of timber harvesting operations.
- 31. The Purchaser agrees that they will meet with the Consulting Forester or their designee in charge of the sale at the premises to go over the sale with that Forester before beginning any activities on the sale.
- 32. The Landowner relinquishes all terms of this contract to the Consulting Forester, who was hired and appointed by the Landowner to oversee and administer all terms of this contract, acting in the best interest of the Landowner.
- 32. Conversion from weight to volume (cord) shall be according to factors in Chapter 13 of the DNR Timber Sale Handbook. if the mill in which the forest products were scaled does not supply conversion factors.
- 33. Title to all forest products shall remain with the Landowner until the products are scaled and paid for by the purchaser. All forest products will be paid for based on mill scale. If the volume of timber exceeds the estimate, as a whole or by species, the purchaser has the obligation to cut it and remove it paying the unit bid price. If there is less timber than estimated, there is no obligation of the landowner to make up the "shortage". The purchaser pays for actual scale.

Bidding and Financing

- 1. Successful bidders will be required to sign contracts for the term ending 8-1-22 with the landowner reserving the right to grant one or more one-year extensions.
- 2. If you would like to see a sample contract, contact the Consulting Forester.
- 3. Signed contracts shall be returned to the Consulting Forester within 10 business days of receipt of the contract with a performance bond (15% of the sale bid value).
- 4. The landowner reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

Roads and Landings

- 1. Location of roads, landings and camps must be approved by the Consulting Forester. All roads and landings must be bladed smooth and clean when the sale is completed.
- 2. Landings, camps and roads will be kept neat, clean and free of garbage, oil cans, plastic bottles, and miscellaneous trash throughout the contract period.
- 3. The use of public road rights-of-way for the skidding, landing or decking of forest products is prohibited unless, pre-approved by the town in which the sale is located. The purchaser will be held responsible for any damages induced to the town road or power line as a result of timber harvesting operations.

Utilization


- 1. All timber marked or designated for cutting shall be cut and utilized whether the quantity is more or less than the estimate.
- 2. Utilization will be to a minimum top diameter of 4 inches for all species, unless otherwise specified in the cutting specifications.
- 3. All merchantable wood cut or pushed over during road construction must be utilized. No new roads will be constructed without prior approval of the Consulting Forester.

Scaling

- 1. All products shall be paid from mill scale. All receipts will be presented to the Consulting Forester.
- 2. All harvested hardwood with a minimum small end diameter of 10 inches inside the bark, at least 50% sound, and with a minimum of 30 bf, after deductions, shall be scaled as a log. All scaling will be done in Scribner Decimal C.
- 3. The standard unit of measure for cordwood is measuring 4'x4'x100' for unpeeled wood. Peeled wood will be converted to the standard cord by adding 12.5% peeled wood to the gross volume measured. A pulp wood tree contains at least one 100" stick with a minimum top dib of 4".
- 4. All wood harvested from the sale area must be accounted for and payment made, including firewood.

Successful bidders agree to furnish the landowner with a certificate of insurance of current coverage under the Worker's Compensation Law, Chapter 102, Wisconsin Stats.

- III. President Pesko stated that public notice of the meeting was properly posted according to Wisconsin Statute 19.84(4). Notice was posted at all school-owned buildings, the School District of Phillips' website, and the Price County Review.
- IV. Public Participation Carrie Setterman read a statement stating her concern over bullying of her son at school.
- V. Administrative and Committee Reports
 - A. Dave Scholz PES Principal Report
 - 1. Students of the Month are Gabriella Ulrich (Grade 3) and Easton Lemke (Grade 2)
 - 2. January 21st will be Winterfest Day at PES with students choosing skating, sledding, swimming, gym/snow time and bowling. Grades 4 and 5 will go to Perkinstown for outdoor activities.
 - 3. The Loggers United Booster Club is sponsoring Kevin Lovegreen as Author-in- Residence at PES. He is the author of Lucky Luke's Hunting Adventures. He will do a large group presentation for K-5 students and then work separately with grades 3, 4 and 5.

 - 2. A new large piece of fab lab equipment was installed with the help of city and county equipment.
 - 3. On January 30th teachers from Phillips will be visiting Aleva-Strum School District to see their business and technology department integration.
 - 4. Winterfest for high school students will be held on February 27th.
 - 5. Middle school students will be going to Forest Springs for winter activities on February 6th.
 - C. Vicki Lemke Pupil Services Director
 - The October 1 childcount for special education was 153. Currently we are serving 157. The special education department currently services seven open enrolled students and has five open enrolled students attending other districts.
 - D. Rick Morgan Superintendent Report
 - 1. Superintendent Morgan has been asked by the State Superintendent to be part of the Accountability Advisory Group along with Jim Lee from CESA #12

- and a representative from Hayward to represent the northern portion of the state. Majority of the meetings will be held via Zoom. Any meeting costs from traveling to Madison will be reimbursed by the State.
- The Convention will be held this week in Milwaukee. Paula Houdek will be attending meetings as a delegate and Board members were encouraged again to provide Paula with any input on resolutions that will be discussed this week.
- 3. The District has approval to transfer monies not used from the initial safety grant to the second year grant. The second year funds will be used for secure entrance projects.
- E. Molly Lehman was not able to attend the meeting. Revenue and expenditure reports are included in the Board packet.
- F. Jessica Roush Student Liaison Report
 - Boys and girls basketball are both doing well in their respective conferences.
 The wrestling team took 1st at the Ladymith tournament. Two powerlifters have already qualified for the state meet.
 - 2. The new show choir was 2nd runner up in their recent competition.
 - 3. The Northwoods Global Ecology students from Phillips and Butternut will be going to Costa Rica April 9-17. They will have a presentation for the Board when they return.
- G. Policy Committee Report
 - 1. The committee continues to work on Policy #384 Therapy Dogs in School and will bring the policy to the full board for first reading when it is completed...
 - 2. Policy #164 Board Member Compensation and Expenses was amended to include state statute language regarding board members refusing compensation. The policy is presented for first reading again this month.
 - 3. The committee recommends that no changes be made to Policy #425 Open Enrollment in reference to available spaces for regular or special education.
- H. Transportation/Facilities Committee Report
 - 1. Facilities: Dave Berens reported on a heating pump rebuild and bringing in a representative from Separmatic to review the pool systems and make recommendations for work to be done. The new engraver was delivered to the woodshop as part of the fab lab.
 - 2. Transportation: Jason McMillan received the settlement worksheet from EMC to scrap bus #14 compared to the cost of repairing it. Due to the age of the bus, Jason's recommendation is to take the settlement.
- I. Business services committee met and discussed:
 - 1. Met for closed session to address technology contract reviews.
 - 2. Joe Fox and Annie Knudson wrote and received an AODA minigrant for \$1,000.00. The purpose of the grant will be for 4th and 5th grade students to produce movies involving topics such as bullying, vaping, etc. These movies will be distributed through CREW and to other districts. Students will be responsible for all aspects of production.
 - 3. The new overtime rule cut off for salary workers is \$35,568.00. The district has one employee that this new rule affects. The district will continue with the current wage and pay any overtime for the rest of this year's contract.
 - 4. The 2018-19 financial audit is complete. CLA will be placed on the agenda for February business services and all board members are invited to attend.
 - 5. Future Wood was the highest bidder for the school forest logging bid at \$109,106.05. This exceeded expectations and will include the new acquisition.
 - 6. Bills were reviewed by Joe Fox.

Discussion held on scheduling and potential of virtual learning opportunities on snow days. Houdek amended her motion to include striking February 26, 2020 as a potential make up day. Motion carried 7-1 (Fox).
 - D. Motion (Krog/Burkart) to resolution authorizing general obligation bonds as follows: BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the School District of Phillips, Price County, Wisconsin that there shall be issued pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$9,860,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a school building and improvement program consisting of: construction of an addition for classrooms and expansion and renovation of the Middle/High School building to create a single K-12 campus; upgrades and site improvements; potential demolition of a portion of Phillips Elementary School; and acquisition of furnishings, fixtures and equipment. Motion carried with roll call vote 7-1 (Houdek)
 - E. Motion (Burkart/Lind) to approve Resolution Providing for a Referendum Election on the Question of the Approval of an Initial Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of General Obligation Bonds in an Amount Not to Exceed \$9,860,000. Motion carried with roll call vote 7-1 (Houdek).
- VII. Consent Items Motion (Burkart/Lind) to approve all consent items. Motion carried 8-0.
 - A. Approved minutes from December 16, 2019 and January 13, 2020 Board meetings.
 - B. Approved personnel report to hire Camaraya Schutte and Gabriella Lehman as paraprofessionals and to accept a resignation from Erica Bockerstette as paraprofessional.
 - C. Approved bills from December 2019 (#346791-346920 and wires) for a total of \$502,852.12.
