

The Board of Education of the School District of Phillips, recognizing that learning is a process, not merely a product, that the educational needs of at least some students may not be congruent with the traditional school calendar, and that summer school can fulfill some students' educational needs which cannot be met during the regular school term, authorizes District sponsorship of a summer school program providing opportunities for enrichment and remedial instruction for students K-12.

- I. Purpose: Summer school programs offered in the School District of Phillips will be designed for the following purposes:
 - A. To strengthen subject areas where students are weak;
 - B. To provide opportunities which are not available during the regular term to enrich students' backgrounds; and/or
 - C. To provide classes deemed necessary for sustaining skills developed during the school term.

- II. Enrollment Qualifications: Summer school will be open to all children whose parents or guardians reside in the District. Non-residents may enroll on a tuition basis. Residents will have priority over non-residents when more children apply than can be accepted. The total enrollment will be limited to the number of children who can be taught and supervised by the staff with the funds allocated by the Board of Education for that purpose; total enrollments will be determined at the conception of each course, and courses will be filled by an open enrollment on a first-come basis or, where appropriate, by selection for a course based upon specific identified criteria.

- III. Curriculum Offerings: Courses will be offered (initiated) on the basis of demand, need, remediation, enrichment or by request. The Board of Education will consider approval of all new programs by its regular May meeting. Prior approval for summer courses may be granted, provided such courses are annually budgeted.

- IV. Attendance: Daily attendance will be taken.
