PUBLIC COMPLAINTS ABOUT EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS 871

The Board recognizes that differences of opinion exist in a democracy and, therefore, realizes that the suitability of particular learning materials used in the schools may be questioned from time to time. For the purpose of this policy, the term "learning materials" includes printed and non-printed materials.

Any residents or employee of the School District of Phillips may raise objections to learning materials used in the District's educational program on the basis of appropriateness. Persons objecting to a particular learning material may file a complaint in accordance with established procedures.

The School District of Phillips shall not discriminate in the selection and evaluation of instructional and library materials on the basis of sex, race, religion, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability, or handicap.
